

Marty Kooistra has been CEO of Habitat for Humanity's Seattle/South King County (HFH S/SKC) affiliate since 2008. Under his leadership, the affiliate has aligned its programs, methods and outcomes around organizational, family, community and environmental sustainability. HFH S/SKC is now recognized for its progressive work in the areas of green building, subsidy & financial sustainability policies, new market tax credits and homebuyer financial readiness. The home improvement outlet, which sells surplus building materials, is now a Habitat benchmark for demonstrating retail operation support of community engagement and sustainability.

In addition to driving the affiliate's capacity to achieve LEED certification on all new single-family detached and multifamily homes, Marty has forged a strong network of local municipalities, nonprofits, businesses, financial institutions, faith-based organizations, academic institutions and government agencies. While championing the remarkable value of volunteer-driven construction as a vehicle for community engagement, Marty has greatly enhanced the affiliate's impact by partnering with financial institutions and NGOs to create additional homeownership opportunities through rehabs and acquisition of foreclosed and distressed properties. His priority on innovative collaborations and public-private partnerships is allowing HFH S/SKC to scale its work to serve substantially more families while also providing unique, mutually-beneficial opportunities that advance a diverse array of community development efforts.

Marty currently serves as vice president of the board of directors for the Housing Development Consortium of Seattle-King County and as secretary of the board of directors for the Washington State Support Organization of Habitat Affiliates. He is a member of the affiliate enhancement committee of Habitat's U.S. council; the state legislative committee of the Washington Low Income Housing Alliance; the community service committee of Seattle Rotary; and the new market tax credit advisory committee of Global Green. Past service positions include: Federal Home Loan Bank advisory council; Lifecycle Building Challenge judge; Iowa Human Services coordinating board; Siouxland diaconal conference; JFA NW Iowa board of directors; and Sioux Empire homeless coalition.

Marty began his career as founder and CEO of a successful diversified construction business. A bachelor's degree in social work from Dordt College allowed him to merge his passion for the built environment with his commitment to social justice and led him directly to the affordable housing sector. In 2003, he was awarded an Archibald Bush Foundation Leadership Fellowship for study at the Joint Center for Housing in the Graduate School of Design and the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University.

Marty held several leadership positions with Habitat for Humanity's international headquarters (HFHI). As regional director, he established standards for accelerated asset recovery and oversaw the Native Peoples Initiative. As vice president of post-Katrina collaborations & strategic partnerships, he convened two powerful Gulf recovery coalitions involving Enterprise Community Partners, Enterprise Corporation of the Delta, HFHI, LISC, NeighborWorks, RALLY, Tulane University, and World Vision. Marty also served as HFHI's director of construction & environmental resources and senior director of global program design & implementation and was appointed to HFHI's enterprise strategic planning leadership team.

A recognized expert in strategic planning, conflict resolution and board development, Marty has facilitated change management with nonprofit boards and staff for more than 20 years. He has been invited to speak, teach and write on affordable housing, community revitalization, poverty alleviation, green building and strategic alliances by a wide variety of organizations, including: AIA Seattle; American Management Association; Association of Strategic Alliance Professionals; Congressional Black Caucus; Corporation for Enterprise Development; Executive Alliance of Nonprofits; Family Support America; Federal Home Loan Bank; Freddie Mac; Housing Assistance Council; Mortgage Bankers Association; National Community Land Trust Network; National Public Radio; NeighborWorks America; New York Regional Association of Grantmakers & The Rockefeller Foundation; North American Association of Christians in Social Work; Qwest; Seafair Foundation; The Salvation Army and the U.S. Department of Energy.

Marty lives in Burien with his wife, Dr. Shari Kooistra, an Issaquah native and UW alum. Daughter Amanda is a nursing student at Dakota Wesleyan University and son Jon is majoring in physics and mathematics at Gustavus Adolphus College.
