



The Seattle LGBT Commission is composed of 16 members 7 appointed by the City Council, 7 appointed by the Mayor, 1 Get Engaged member and 1 appointed by the commission itself. All appointments are subject to City Council confirmation. Attached to this memorandum is the current membership roster of the LGBT Commission.
