This fee includes the use of a parking meter hood, padlock and key which shall remain the property of the city. In case hoods, padlocks or keys become lost or destroyed or so defaced that they are no longer usable, the permittee shall reimburse the city ((in accordance with the schedule adopted by the Board of Public Works)) Twenty Dollars (\$20) for issuance of a new hood and shall reimburse the city Eight Dollars (\$8) for each new padlock and Two Dollars (\$2) for each new key.

Service parking permits issued under this chapter shall, unless revoked, be valid for a twelve-month period from July 1st to the following June 30th, or for any portion of the twelve-month period from the date of issuance to the date of expiration which shall be no later than the following June 30th.

Section 4. Section 11.26.280 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinance 108200, Section 2) are each amended as follows:

11.26.280 Service parking-Violation.

The use of a service parking permit shall be in conformance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the ((Board of Public Works)) Traffic Engineer. It shall be unlawful for a holder of a valid service parking permit to use a service hood in a manner contrary to the rules and regulations.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect as of January 1, 1982.
Collection of the fees authorized herein as of January 1, 1982 is hereby
ratified and confirmed.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and
approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the
provisions of the city charter.



Re: Service Parking Permit Fees

Dear Sir:

We request adoption by the City Council of the attached legislation which amends Sections 11.26.020, 11.26.060, 11.26.260 and 11.26.280 of the Seattle Municipal Code to provide for an increase in the Service Parking Permit fees, to make the fee schedule a part of the Municipal Code and to delete any requirements for Board of Public Works approvals.

The Seattle Municipal Code presently authorizes the Traffic Engineer to issue upon application, permits for service parking upon payment of the prescribed fee as established by the Board of Public Works. When a permit is granted, the permit holder is issued a service hood to use in covering any parking meter other than 15 minute meters, or for display in the vehicle where parking is controlled by time limit posting rather than by parking meters.

To defray the cost of issuing annual permits and meter hoods, and to offset a portion of the revenue loss incurred from having parking meters covered, we are requesting this fee increase. All Service Parking Permit fees are deposited in the General Fund.

The attached legislation also makes the Service Parking Permit fee schedule a part of the Municipal Code and deletes all references to the Board of Public Works in adopting the fees.



ORDINANCE 108283

AN ORDINANCE relating to vehicles and traffic, amending Sections 11.26.020, 11.26.060, 11.26.260 and 11.26.280 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Section 2 of Ordinance 108200), to provide for an increase in the Service Parking Permit fees; to make the fee schedule a part of the Seattle Municipal Code; and, to delete any requirement for Board of Public Works approvals.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 11.26.020 of the Seattle Municipal Code, (Ordinance 108200, Section 2) are each amended as follows:

11.26.020 Service parking.

The Traffic Engineer is authorized to issue upon application permits for service parking upon payment of the prescribed fee as established ((by the Board of Public Works)) herein. As many permits may be issued to any one applicant as the Traffic Engineer deems necessary or convenient.

Section 2. Section 11.26.060 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinance 108200, Section 2) are each amended as follows:

11.26.060 Service parking meter hoods.

The holder of a valid service parking permit shall be issued a service hood, padlock and keys to use in covering any parking meter, other than fifteen-minute meters, or for display in the vehicle where parking is controlled by time limit posting rather than by parking meters. As many service hoods may be issued as the Traffic Engineer deems necessary or convenient for the application upon payment of the prescribed fee.

Section 3. Section 11.26.260 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinance 108200, Section 2) are each amended as follows:

11.26.260 Service parking permit-Fee-Time period.

The fee for the service parking permit shall be ((in accordance with the fee schedule adopted by the Board of Public Works for service parking permits)) as follows:

The fee for the service parking permit shall be Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) per permit per year or Twenty Five Dollars (\$25) per permit per month, or portion thereof for periods less than one year.

This fee includes the use of a parking meter hood, padlock and key which shall remain the property of the city. In case hoods, padlocks or keys become lost or destroyed or so defaced that they are no longer usable, the permittee shall reimburse the city ((in accordance with the schedule adopted by the Board of Public Works)) Twenty Dollars (\$20) for issuance of a new hood and shall reimburse the city Eight Dollars (\$8) for each new padlock and Two Dollars (\$2) for each new key.

Service parking permits issued under this chapter shall, unless revoked, be valid for a twelve-month period from July 1st to the following June 30th, or for any portion of the twelve-month period from the date of issuance to the date of expiration which shall be no later than the following June 30th.

Section 4. Section 11.26.280 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinance 108200, Section 2) are each amended as follows:

11.26.280 Service parking-Violation.
