1 1301 Alaskan Way, in Seattle (the improvement is referred to as Pier 57 for the purposes of this
2 ordinance), is hereby acknowledged.

3 A. Legal Description. Pier 57 is located on the property legally described as:

4
5 A portion of Lot 10, and all of Lots 11 and 12, Block 176 of Supplemental Maps
6 of Seattle Tide Lands in King County, described as follows:

7 Beginning at point 485.941 feet South 25 degrees 21 minutes 48 seconds East
8 from a point on said tide land plat marked "81" on replat of Seattle Tide Lands;
9 Thence South 25 degrees 41 minutes 48 seconds East along inner harbor line,
10 159.306 feet; Thence due East to the westerly line of Railroad Avenue in said
11 replat; Thence North 31 degrees 45 minutes 10 seconds West along said westerly
12 line of Railroad Avenue to a point directly East from the point of beginning;
13 Thence due West to the inner harbor line and point of beginning same being a
14 portion of Lots 10 and all of lots 11 and 12 in Block 176 of Seattle Tide Lands
15 Supplemental Plat; Except that portion thereof lying within University Street;

16 Together with that portion of the vacated northerly 20 feet in width of University
17 Street as vacated by Ordinance No. 4907 adjoining lot 12 in Block 176 of the
18 Supplemental Plat of Seattle Tide Lands and lying between the westerly line of
19 Alaskan Way (formerly Railroad Avenue) as Platted 100 feet in width in said
20 supplemental Plat and the inner harbor line;

21 And together with that portion of the leased harbor area adjoining lying between
22 the westerly prolongation of the North and South lines of the above-described
23 tract and lying easterly of the outer harbor line;

24 All as shown on the official supplemental maps of Seattle Tide Lands on file in
25 the Office of the Commissioner of Public Lands at Olympia, Washington;

26 Situate in the City of Seattle, County of King, State of Washington.

27 B. Specific Features and/or Characteristics Designated. Pursuant to SMC

28 25.12.660.A.2, the following specific features and/or characteristics of Pier 57 are designated: the
pier pilings from the west edge of the right-of-way of Alaskan Way (the seawall) to the outer
harbor line, and from the north edge of the pier pilings to the south edge of the pilings; the



1 exterior pier shed; and the exposed interior truss system as it existed at the time of designation.

2 The existing parking area on the west end of Pier 57 and any portions of Waterfront Park (Pier
3 58) that lie within the site as described in Section 1.A. are excluded from the designation.

4 C. Basis of Designation. The designation was made because Pier 57 is more than 25
5 years old and has significant character, interest or value as a part of the development, heritage or
6 cultural characteristics of the City, state or nation, it has integrity or the ability to convey its
7 significance, and because it satisfies the following from SMC 25.12.350:
8

- 9 1. It is associated in a significant way with a significant aspect of the cultural,
10 political, or economic heritage of the community, City, state, or nation (SMC
11 25.12.350.C);
12
13 2. It embodies the distinctive visible characteristics of an architectural style, period,
14 or of a method of construction (SMC 25.12.350.D); and
15
16 3. Because of its prominence of spatial location, contrast of siting, age, or scale, it is
17 an easily identifiable visual feature of the neighborhood or the city and contributes
18 to the distinctive quality or identity of such neighborhood or city (SMC
19 25.12.350.F).

20 Section 2. CONTROLS: The following controls are hereby imposed on the features and
21 characteristics of Pier 57 that were designated by the Board for preservation:

22 A. Certificate of Approval Process.

- 23
24 1. Except as provided in Section 2.A.2 or Section 2.B of this ordinance, the owner
25 must obtain a Certificate of Approval issued by the Board pursuant to SMC
26



1 Chapter 25.12 and the Central Waterfront Piers Design Guidelines (LPB 176/08),
2 or the time for denying a Certificate of Approval must have expired, before the
3 owner may make alterations or significant changes to the following specific
4 features or characteristics: the pier pilings from the west edge of the right-of-way
5 of Alaskan Way (the seawall) to the outer harbor line, and from the north edge of
6 the pier pilings to the south edge of the pilings; the exterior pier shed; and the
7 exposed interior truss system as it existed at the time of designation. The existing
8 parking area on the west end of Pier 57 and any portions of Waterfront Park (Pier
9 58) that lie within the site as described in Section 1.A. are excluded from the
10 designation.
11

- 12
- 13 2. No Certificate of Approval or approval by the CHPO is required for the following:
- 14 a. Any in-kind maintenance or repairs of the features listed in Section 2.A.1.
- 15 b. The removal and/or addition of the following landscape elements: small trees
- 16 under 6 inches in caliper, shrubs, perennials and annuals.
- 17
- 18 c. The addition of safety and security lighting and cameras on the south, north,
- 19 east, and west elevations of the pier.
- 20
- 21 d. The addition of street furniture, umbrellas, vendor carts, tents for temporary
- 22 events and bicycle racks that are not permanently affixed to the designated
- 23 features.

24 B. CHPO Approval Process.

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- 1 1. The CHPO may review and approve the items listed in Section 2.B.3 of this
2 ordinance according to the following procedure:
 - 3 a. The owner shall submit to the CHPO a written request for the alterations,
4 including applicable drawings and/or specifications.
 - 5 b. If the CHPO, upon examination of submitted plans and specifications,
6 determines that the alterations are consistent with the purposes of SMC
7 Chapter 25.12 and the Central Waterfront Piers Design Guidelines, the
8 alterations shall be approved without further action by the Board.
 - 9 c. If the CHPO does not approve the alterations, the owner may submit revised
10 materials to the CHPO, or apply to the Board for a Certificate of Approval
11 under SMC Chapter 25.12, as provided in Section 2.A.
- 12 2. The CHPO shall transmit a written decision on the owner's request to the owner
13 within 14 business days of receipt of the request. Failure of the CHPO to approve
14 or disapprove the request shall constitute approval of the request.
- 15 3. CHPO approval for changes or alterations to the designated features or
16 characteristics of the landmark described in Section 1.B of this ordinance, is
17 available for the following:
 - 18 a. For the specified features and characteristics of the building, the addition or
19 elimination of duct conduits, HVAC vents, grilles, fire escapes, pipes, and
20 other similar wiring or mechanical elements necessary for the normal
21 operation of the building; and changes that encourage energy efficiency and
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1 renewable energy efforts including but not limited to solar panels and sky
2 lights.

- 3 b. The replacement of deteriorated wood pier pilings and decking with other
4 materials as necessary to meet requirements of applicable environmental
5 regulations. The Landmarks Preservation Board and the CHPO recognize the
6 unique maintenance challenges of the saltwater environment, and that state
7 and federal regulations make it no longer possible to replace existing wood
8 pier pilings and wood decking in-kind, but that it is important that the
9 replacement be sympathetic. Specifically, the Washington State Department
10 of Natural Resources does not authorize the use of treated wood for pilings or
11 decking replacement of deteriorated wood. Treated wood includes wood
12 treated with creosote, AZCA (Ammoniacal Copper Arsenate), and CCA Type
13 C (Chromated Copper Arsenate). Acceptable alternative wood replacement
14 products for pier pilings and decking are steel, concrete, and recycled plastic,
15 as well as other materials that allow for light penetration through decking.
16
17 c. Alterations to the projecting bay addition on the west elevation of Pier 57.
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19 d. New building signage where there is an approved signage plan in place.
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21 e. Replacement of existing awnings, if not in-kind.
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23 Section 3. INCENTIVES. The following incentives are hereby granted on the features
24 and characteristics of Pier 57 that were designated by the Board for preservation:

- 25 A. Uses not otherwise permitted in a zone may be authorized in a designated
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1 Landmark by means of an administrative conditional use permit issued pursuant to Seattle

2 Municipal Code (SMC) Title 23.

3 B. Exceptions to certain requirements of the Seattle Building Code, SMC Chapter
4 22.100, and the Energy Code of the City, SMC Chapter 22.700, may be authorized pursuant to
5 the applicable provisions thereof.

6 C. Special tax valuation for historic preservation may be available under Chapter
7 84.26 RCW upon application and compliance with the requirements of that statute.

8 Section 4. Enforcement of this ordinance and penalties for its violation are as provided in
9 SMC 25.12.910.

10 Section 5. Pier 57 is hereby added alphabetically to Section II, Buildings, of the Table of
11 Historical Landmarks contained in SMC Chapter 25.32.

12 Section 6. The City Clerk is directed to record a certified copy of this ordinance with the
13 King County Director of Records and Elections, deliver two certified copies to the CHPO, and
14 deliver one copy to the Director of the Department of Planning and Development. The CHPO is
15 directed to provide a certified copy of the ordinance to the owner of the landmark.
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


1 Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by

3 shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to historic preservation, imposing controls and granting incentives upon Pier 57, a landmark designated by the Landmarks Preservation Board under Chapter 25.12 of the Seattle Municipal Code, and adding it to the Table of Historical Landmarks contained in Chapter 25.32 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

Summary of the Legislation:

The attached legislation acknowledges the designation of Pier 57 as a historic landmark by the Landmarks Preservation Board (the Board), imposes controls, grants incentives, and adds Pier 57 to the Table of Historical Landmarks contained in SMC Chapter 25.32. The legislation does not have a financial impact.

Background:

Pier 57 was built in 1902 and is located in the Central Waterfront. A Controls and Incentives Agreement (Agreement) has been signed by the owner and has been approved by the Landmarks Preservation Board. The controls in the Agreement apply to the pier pilings from the west edge of the right-of-way of Alaskan Way (the seawall) to the outer harbor line, and from the north edge of the pier pilings to the south edge of the pilings; the exterior pier shed; and the exposed interior truss system that existed at the time of designation, but do not apply to any in-kind maintenance or repairs of the designated features. The existing parking area on the west end of Pier 57 and any portions of Waterfront Park (Pier 58) are excluded from the designation.

During the Controls and Incentives negotiation process, Central Waterfront Piers Design Guidelines that apply to Piers 54, 55, 56, 57, and 59 were developed in coordination between the property owners and Historic Preservation Program staff. The Board has adopted these Guidelines for their use in reviewing and making decisions regarding Certificates of Approval applications and for the use of the City Historic Preservation Officer for this group of properties.





12 Section 6. The City Clerk is directed to record a certified copy of this ordinance with the
13 King County Director of Records and Elections, deliver two certified copies to the CHPO, and
14 deliver one copy to the Director of the Department of Planning and Development. The CHPO is
15 directed to provide a certified copy of the ordinance to the owner of the landmark.
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1 Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by
2 the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it
3 shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.


